Celebrate libraries and library workers during National Library Week April 18-24. It's a time to rediscover all that Parmly Billings Library has to offer and why there's something for everyone. Usually people think of books when they think of libraries, but that's only the start of what you will discover when you walk in the door or click on the website at www.billings.lib.mt.us. There are movies for the weekend, audiobooks for your next trip, online resources for those last-minute research projects, computer games, storytimes and more.

Parmly Billings Library celebrates the successes of the past year as well. Over 1800 children and teens "Laughed It Up at the Library" during the Summer Reading Program. The Library helped host the inaugural High Plains Bookfest with a slate of programs. We hosted our first Poetry Slam for teens. Half a dozen Library-organized bookgroups discussed the first One Book Montana selection, Winter Wheat by Mildred Walker. Nearly every day of the year, the Library held a program - everything from jobhunting for teens, crafts for kids, and free presentations on any subject you can imagine.

Join us during National Library Week. On Sunday, April 18, we're having a kickoff celebration from 2-4 pm. The Children's Services staff has storytimes on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings at 10:30 am, and will show videos on Friday morning at 10:30 am. On Tuesday evening at 7:00 pm, attend a program exploring the concepts of Feng Shui. At Wednesday night's program at 7:00 pm, learn to protect yourself from identity theft. The Teen Pit

hosts the teen bookgroup's discussion of *Red Midnight* by Ben Mikaelsen on Thursday evening at 7:00 pm. Come be part of the festivity – we would love to have you with us!


The next Friends Board meeting will be Wednesday, March 31, at 11:00 a.m. on the third floor of the Library. Any Friends member is welcome to attend.
