At the recent annual conference of the Montana Library Association in Bozeman, Parmly's Outreach Librarian Gene Robson was honored as the Librarian of the Year, the highest honor that a librarian can receive in the state.

Gene was recognized for over 30 years of service to Parmly Billings Library, as well as to the profession of librarianship in Montana. Specifically, she was recognized for the success of Parmly's Senior/Homebound Outreach program which she developed over 10 years ago. This program regularly takes library materials to 17 different nursing homes and senior residential facilities in Billings, and makes deliveries to over 50 homebound patrons in the area.

In upcoming months, the Library will feature a series that highlights Film Noir movies. It also plans to do a series of foreign films.



LIBRARY SCHEDULES TEEN PROGRAMS THIS SUMMER

This summer teens will have their own programming for the annual Summer Reading Program. Movies will be shown on Wednesday afternoons from 2 – 4 in the Teen Pit. These will include *The Three Stooges* (June 9th), *Holes* (June 23rd), *Lizzie McGuire Movie* (June 30), *Tarzan Escapes* (July 14th) and *Freaky Friday* (July 21st).

Likewise, teens will be able to participate in an Internet scavenger Hunt on June 16th, a poetry writing workshop on July 9th at 10:00 and a program on comic books and Japanese anime on July 10th at 1:00. And, they are all invited to participate in an ice cream social on July 7th in the Teen Pit. The purpose of this social is to invite teens to let us know what changes need to be made in the Teen Pit and to make suggestions for materials to be added or programs to be developed. Teens who want to have a say in what happens in the Teen Pit are invited to this ice cream social.

The monthly teen book discussion group will continue to meet in the Teen Pit. Remember, the Friends of the Library furnish copies of the titles that we are discussing. On June 24 the group will read and discuss *Gold Dust* by Chris Lynch and on July 22 the book will be *Don't You Know There's a War Going On* by Avi. These discussions will begin at 7:00 p.m

Teens will also be eligible for prizes by reading books and earning coupons. Prizes will be awarded at the end of Summer Reading.

LIBRARY TO PARTICIPATE IN HIGH PLAINS BOOKFEST

The second annual High Plains Bookfest will be held in Billings on July 9 – 11. Over 60 writers from Montana and the region will participate in readings, lectures and panel discussions on subjects as diverse as memoir writing, mysteries, Western history, poetry and the enivronment. These activities will take place at MSU-Billings, the Western Heritage Center, the Yellowstone Art Museum and the Mansfield Center.

Parmly Billings Library will sponsor the following programs as part of the Bookfest:

Buckley will present a special program for teens titled *How to Create a Poem: A Poetry-Writing Workshop for Teens.* Ms. Buckley has edited poetry anthologies and has taught poetry writing at schools throughout the region. 1:00 – 2:30. Jodi Robertson, from Bozeman, will present a program titled *Where Do Stories Come From? A Writing Workshop for Children.* Ms. Robertson is the author of *'Til the Cows Come Home* and this workshop will be for 3rd - 6th grade children. She will talk about how to take an idea and turn it into a story and then will work with the participants as they create their own stories. To register for this program, call 657-8256.
