medal winners were announced at the
American Library Association's mid-winter
meeting on January 14, 2008.

The **Newbery Medal**, named in
honor of John Newbery, has been
awarded annually since 1922. The
medal is presented to the author of

The medal is presented to the author of the most distinguished contribution to literature for children published in the U.S. in the preceding year. The 2008 medal was awarded to Laura Amy Schlitz for her book Good Masters! Sweet Ladies! Voices from a Medieval Village. The **Caldecott Medal**,

named in honor of 19th century illustrator Randolph Caldecott, has been awarded annually since 1938. The medal is given to the illustrator of the most distinguished picture book for children published in the U.S. during the preceding year. The 2008 medal was awarded to author/illustrator Brian Selznick for his book, The Invention of Hugo Cabret.
