MONTANA REPERTORY THEATER COMING TO LIBRARY

The Montana Repertory Theater, from the University of Montana, will present a performance of *The Hemingway Project* on Thursday, September 29th at 7:00 p.m. on the third floor of the Library.

The Hemingway Project, based on the works of Ernest Hemingway, is a 60 minute dramatic piece produced through the collaborative efforts of Carol Hemingway, Ernest's daughterin-law and the MRT's artistic directory Greg Johnson, and displays that the high literary content of one of the giants of American Literature.

The program is funded by the Friends of the Library, who will also serve refreshments.


