Saturday, October 13<sup>th</sup>: **Milagro Beanfield War** (Rated R).


Each of these films will start at 11 a.m. on the third floor meeting room.

## LIBRARY OFFERS INTERNET AND CATALOG CLASSES

Library staff will offer 3 classes in September that cover Internet basics, the use of the Library's public access catalog and the use of the various magazine databases available on the catalog.

The following classes will be offered:

**Library Catalog**, Thursday, September 6<sup>th</sup>, 4 p.m.

This class provides an introduction to the Library's computer catalog, and shows how to find materials in the Library.

**Online Databases**, Thursday, September 20<sup>th</sup>, 4 p.m.

This class will focus on the Library's online subscription databases and the various types of information available through them.

**Internet Basics**, Saturday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 9 a.m.

This class is designed for those comfortable with computers but with little experience on the Internet. It will teach the basics of search engines and finding information on the Internet. Users must know how to use a computer mouse to take the class.
