While in "transition," it seems a good time to remind what the Friends are about. The **Friends of the Library** is a nonprofit group of volunteers. Our mission is to promote and enhance Library usage through volunteerism and financial assistance. We volunteer at Library events, help with special projects and sponsor cultural performances. We organize sales of surplus books donated to the Library to raise money for new materials and programs.

Our book sale revenues support literacy with the *Books for Babies project*, which delivers to every newborn, in both hospitals, a packet which includes a board book, an introduction to the Library and its reading programs, and a simple instruction book for the caregivers.

Through our donation, *Reading Rocks*, the School District's summer reading program in the parks, gave over 2,100 books to children from preschool to sixth grade. We provide *withdrawn library books* to the Yellowstone Detention Center and Montana Women's Prison libraries, the YWCA and the MSU Passages program. The Friends sponsor the *Fiction Award for the High Plains Book Awards*, underwrite *musical performances*, purchase book club kits and One Book Billings reader copies, and support the Billings Library Foundation's Food For Thought.

PIN Numbers

Do you know your Library PIN number? The Library recently added security to your Library account by requiring a PIN number at the self-checks and when signing on to computers. If you lose your card, nobody can use your card to check out unless they have your PIN number. If you don't have or don't remember your PIN, there are two ways to get it. If you have your email address on file at the library, just click on the "Catalog" link on the Library's website. At the top right are options to either reset or have the PIN number emailed to you.
