The two volunteers oversee the Biography and History sections, and many shoppers seek out these topics sale after sale. "It's so rewarding," Steel commented, "when people ask for a subject and we can take them right to it."

Considering the large number of donations and the care Steel and Vogel expend shelving books by categories and subcategories, theirs is a daunting task. The goal is to make book hunting as easy as possible for sale-goers. While the majority of biographies are arranged alphabetically by the subject's last name (currently, Madeleine Albright to Chuck Yeager), special sections are devoted

to individuals in specific fields. Under Adventure, you'll find polar explorers and mountaineers, for example, while the Newsmen shelf includes the likes of Dan Rather and Charles Kuralt. Not surprisingly, Entertainers is a mixed category where Shirley MacLaine and Frank Sinatra sit among stars of all genres.
