NOTES/OUTCOME	<p>Low income housing credits</p> <p>Growing senior population</p> <p>Montana one of fastest growth rates for senior plus largest number of senior</p> <p>Finalist of 8 projects across the state for 5 spots</p> <p>Asking council for formal support for St John’s project</p> <p>Opportunity with tax credits for lower cost capital</p> <p>54 Double (500+ sq ft) of residence units</p> <p>Display board of conceptual drawings for project</p> <p>7 million dollars in tax credits, 3 million additional dollars = 10 million project</p>

- Mayor – sample letter in packet, no formal Council action needed.
- Ewalt – independent or assisted living units? Independent living units, purchase additional services from St John’s, housing would still be affordable if assisted living services would be needed.
- Gibbs – target population? Average age 89, qualifying age 62. What income? Tax credit project, citizens <60% area median income (\$45,000), access to all amenities. What other organizations are supporting? Don Sterhan: Letters are still being collected, Riverstone Health, Family Service, Senior Service Center.
- Yakawich – Where will residence go during construction? Go nowhere, if awarded credits, stop new clients, during design stage relocate out of construction area to other parts, management of vacancies.
- Ronning – great project, affordable living for senior. Do you know who competitors are? Predominantly on western part of Montana.
- Mayor – if we sign letter there may still be other building, land use, etc. items to handle.

- Don Sterhan, 3104 East McDonald, Billings, Montana: project extremely important, trying to distinguish project from everyone else, should know sometime in November if the incentive is received.

- Joy – haven't completed county growth study, how is data used? Wyeth commented on county planning.
- Friedel – Blue Creek Road what is happening? Micro-transportation plan identified many items.
- Yakawich – 2 million for program, what did we accomplish last year? Contract with transportation plan, public participation plan, modeling project, for planning not brick and mortar, put bullet points on outcomes of money.
- Gibbs – concerns around schools? On City's radar, and Public Works radar,

- Clark – like Mondays, task forces meet on Tuesday and would conflict.

- Yakawich – Councilmembers can hold themselves more accountable for using less time, self-included.
