Project Homelessness is a joint effort sponsored by *Venture Theatre* and the *Billings Metro VISTA Project* to heighten awareness and illustrate the circumstances of the 500 children experiencing homelessness in Billings. The project is supported by the City of Billings as a component of **Welcome Home Billings**, the City’s ten-year plan to impact homelessness.

Jessie Obee and Amy Dixon, AmeriCorps VISTA members, have been working for Project Homelessness since July 2012. They reached out to non-profits fighting poverty to research the state of homelessness in Billings and interviewed thirteen homeless children and young adults.

Ryan M. Gage and Shad Allen Scott wrote the script. Christie Anderson (director) and the cast brought the story to life. The play follows the journeys inspired by real children experiencing homelessness in Billings and the people that have shaped and influenced them.

Project Homelessness is raising money through sponsorships and donations for Venture’s Youth Conservatory to provide financial aid to disadvantaged children to take theatre classes and attend summer camps. Theatre training gives children many skills they need to become successful adults, such as empathy, confidence and leadership. These skills can break generational cycles of poverty.

Sponsorships are also supporting the *Billings Community Connect* event scheduled for January 2014. This annual one-day, one-stop event ensures over 50 service providers are on hand to help our community members out of poverty by creating access to food, housing and other services.

Facts about youth and family homelessness in Billings:

There are currently 511 children experiencing homelessness in the school district. This number does not include children too young to attend school, drop-outs, home-schooled students, and runaways.

The Billings community lacks sufficient shelter for youth and children experiencing homelessness.

Twenty-four percent of the caregivers in homeless families are employed.

Sixty-three percent of the caregivers in homeless families have at least a high school education, and 20% have attended college.

Domestic violence, mental health issues, and addiction are the leading causes of family homelessness in Billings.
