ABANDONED VEHICLES

Any car, truck, motorcycle, motorhome, or other driveable vehicle parked on a City street must be currently licensed, operable, and driven every 5 days. Once a vehicle has been stickered, the owner has a minimum of 5 days to rectify the situation, otherwise it will be towed.

FINGERPRINTING

The Crime Prevention Center will fingerprint the public for background checks by appointment only. Customers need to bring a current picture ID. There is a fee for this service.



FOUND BIKES

If a bike has been abandoned, the CPC will pick it up and take it to Evidence to be stored.

VOLUNTEERING

The CPC uses volunteers to supplement BPD Officers. We always need volunteers to help out and assist with report writing and patrolling. All applicants are required to pass a background check.

- Christmas presents
- Cellphones/Music devices

Outdoor Security Checklist

- Address visible from the street
- Trees/shrubs trimmed away from the house
- Street lamps are working
- All gates locked
- Fuse box/utility boxes locked
- Shed locked
- Motion lights surround the home
- 180 degree view of the property
- Bike/lawn equipment securely stored
- Cameras are mounted at eye level
- No access to window wells
- Yard is fenced/surrounded with barrier
- Active neighborhood communication



Indoor Security Checklist

- Solid core doors
- Single cylinder deadbolt on doors
- High security strike plate on doors
- Windows are locked and pinned
- Dowell in sliding doors/windows
- Security film on doors and windows
- Unable to unlock doors through dog door
- Dog door is locked/too small for humans
- Skylights secured
- Safe bolted down
- House is alarmed
- Door between garage and house is locked
- Door between cellar/crawlspace secured



Vacation Checklist

- Stop mail/paper

- House sitter

- Lights on timers

- Deactivate garage door

- Lawn mowed/snow shoveled

- Garbage emptied

- Valuables locked up
